Introduction:

The role

The role is part of the wider Global Accounting Team, and is responsible for the accuracy of fund accounting globally, by ensuring:

- MSI (globally) is accurately accounting for all donor income to which it is entitled including all indirect grant income and performance related income.
- MSI fully understands the financial implications of all new projects and promptly closes the financial accounting for all projects with no outstanding balances.
- Support is provided to Country Programme teams to complete accounting and reporting on projects and ensure all project accounting complies with MSI regulations and specific grant/donor requirements.

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- The composition of the donor pipeline (secured and unsecured) is analysed so it can be integrated with MSI business planning and forecasting processes.
- Reports are compiled by analysing and interpreting project data, enabling Senior Management to have visibility over the donor pipeline to enable decision making.
- With the leadership of the Senior Manager Donor Forecast & Pipeline Development, support is provided to the wider Donor Finance Team to ensure key processes are streamlined and automated using systems available, driving a culture of innovation to ensure the team is consistently looking for the optimal way to manage the overall donor portfolio.
- Create strong links with other departments within MSI including Informatics, Regional Finance Teams, Country Programme Finance Teams and Donor Teams.

Key Responsibilities

The successful candidate will be responsible for supporting the month end and year end processes which relate to MSI's donor funded portfolio. In addition, the candidate will support the Senior Manager – Donor Forecast & Pipeline Development to maintain accurate donor pipeline data and continuously look to improve and automate this process and other processes overseen by the donor finance team to enable the to work efficiently and be remain responsive to the changing donor landscape. The candidate will have advanced excel skills and a commitment to continuous improvement of how the team works.

Grant income recognition

- Ensure MSI (Globally) is accurately accounting for all donor grant income, including direct grant income, indirect income, and performance related income.
- Account for funding provided to external implementing partners.

Project Accounting

- Ensure invoices are submitted to donors on a timely basis and monitor grants receivable balances on a regular basis to ensure invoices have been paid.
- Provide information to ensure accurate cash flow forecasting and monitor receipts in line with forecast.
- Reconcile deferred income balances on a project-by-project basis ensuring linkage to donor reports, prepare journals to recognise foreign exchange gains and losses.
- Ensure that the treatment of financial transactions in designated country programmes is in line with MSI financial policies and procedures, best practice and follows donor compliance.
- Ensure performance margins for payment by results projects are appropriately tracked and accounted for

Project cycle management

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- Ensure that MSI has a good understanding of project coding, grant and contract payment terms, start and end dates, indirect income calculations and the location of cash received at the commencement of a project.
- Ensure MSI promptly closes the financial accounting for all projects, with no remaining balances.
- Ensure that project codes are opened/closed as necessary.
- Ensure project data is accurately captured in reports throughout the project life cycle and use these reports for further data analysis and trend analysis.

Statutory and Donor Audits

- Ensure year end analysis of project balances is sufficient to enable restricted project activity to be included within MSI statutory accounts.
- Assist partners and in-country staff in preparing for donor audits and provide necessary information and paperwork.

Automation and process improvement

- Help develop tools for the team to streamline processes and tools used during budgeting, project implementation and close out.
- Work closely with global finance teams to troubleshoot and derive improved ways of managing the finances on donor funded projects.
- Support the Senior Manager Donor Forecast & Pipeline Development with system transformations which impact the Donor Finance Team.

Project business partnering

- Provide training to key stakeholders on key tools and templates used within the team.
- Respond to ad-hoc stakeholder requests and provide technical assistance as needed.
- Conversion of complex financial concepts and analysis into understandable language for end users.
- Review and analysis of current and historic donor finance data, compiling graphs and charts required by senior stakeholders in the organisation.

Other work

 Undertake any other reasonable duties, as requested by the Senior Manager – Donor Forecast & Pipeline Development or Associate Director of Donor Finance.
